Code of Conduct for Students

1. INTRODUCTION

IIT Jodhpur is required to develop technical human resources that are assets to the country. Students undergo major transitions during their stay at the Institute, especially the undergraduate students, who need to grow from girls and boys to ladies and gentlemen, and also develop fundamental understanding of the discipline they have enrolled to study. And, a critical trait that they need to internalize is the *discipline of mind*, without which their training is incomplete to be able to face the real world *respectfully* and *objectively*.

It is required that each student of IIT Jodhpur is given a *Code of Conduct* to observe; each student should follow the procedures laid therein, and strive to internalize the same at the earliest. This document describes the salient aspects of the said Code of Conduct. In general, any behavior that negatively affects the progress and/or smooth functioning of the Institute (including life of a fellow stakeholder of the Institute) constitutes violation of the Code of Conduct. In all matters of discipline, the norms presented in this document shall stand as a reference document. Should there be newer situations than those articulated in this document, the decision of the Committee constituted to review the same, shall form the basis for the Institute's Administration to take an objective decision on the matter.

2. THE CODE OF CONDUCT

Each student shall conduct herself or himself in a manner befitting the dignity of IIT Jodhpur, an Institute of national importance. Each student is expected to be involved only in such activities that are likely to maintain the prestige of the Institute. Each student shall show due respect and courtesy to Staff Members, Faculty Members and Administrators, and due affection to fellow Students. Due attention and courtesy shall be paid to visitors to the Institute and all residents of the Residential Campus.

Some of the desirable traits of students include: courtesy and decorum (both within and outside the Institute); not damaging and/or removing Institute property or belongings of fellow students; allowing fellow students to pursue their studies without disturbance; adopting only fair means during examinations; embracing with grace the rules and regulations of the Institute; and calm and seemly behavior. It is enjoined upon all students to abide by all rules and regulations, formulated and implemented by various bodies and offices of the Institute. Code of Conduct pertaining to select aspects of student life is discussed in sections below.

2.1 Handling and Use of Prohibited Substances:

Smoking is prohibited in all areas of the Institute including residential premises. Also, possession and consumption of alcohol is prohibited on campus. Further, no student or their guests shall stock, consume, distribute or encourage any student on campus to use the any of substance (such as cigarette, alcohol, prohibited drugs, tobacco, and their variants in any form), which are prohibited by the Indian laws is applicable at Karwad, Jodhpur District. Violators in this regard will be treated as per the applicable Laws of the Nation and of the State of Rajasthan. Any student, who is aware of such prohibited activities, shall report the matter confidentially in person to the Coordinator (Students).

2.2 Ragging

Ragging in any form is a serious offense. Any conduct by a student or a group of them, whether by words spoken or written, or by an act, which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, will be treated as ragging. Further, asking any student to do any act, which that student objects to do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, torment or embarrassment (adversely affecting the physique or psyche of the student) will be treated as ragging. All such cases will be dealt with as per the Guidelines given by the Supreme Court of India. More details on what constitutes ragging and the measures that need to be taken to eliminate it, are placed on the Institute website.

2.3 Sexual Harassment

Utmost care needs to be taken by each student, to ensure that his/her behavior is impeccable towards persons of opposite gender. In particular, any unwelcome behavior towards female students and employees, whether spoken, written, gestural or physical, directly or indirectly, would be dealt with as per the national law on Prohibition of Sexual Harassment at Work Places. Harassment includes, but is not limited to, striking, laying hands upon, intimidation, threatening with violence or doing bodily harm or invasion of privacy. It can be of verbal nature and include suggestive comments, insults, humour and jokes about sex or gender-specific traits, and sexual propositions, whether done directly or through email or any other mode of communication. Persons who are victims of emotional/sexual harassment of any form may approach the members of the Women Cell. The complaints can be registered with the Convenor, Women Cell, IIT Jodhpur. Detailed information are available at the Institute Website.

2.4 Interaction with Media and Online Activities

No student shall interact with, participate in any show of or contribute any article to any form of media, except with the prior approval of the Coordinator (Students). Approval is not required, if the contribution is purely literary, artistic or scientific character. Further, no student shall publish anything or participate in broadcast, either anonymously or in his or her name, that has the effect of adverse criticism of any current or recent policy or action of the Institute or which is capable of embarrassing the relations between the Institute and the Central Government, any State Government, any other Institute or organization or any member of the public.

Students shall ensure that internet facility, given by the Institute is not misused. Internet resources are intended for holistic development of the student. Further, each student is responsible for ensuring that he/she does not violate Cyber Laws of the Country and the IT Infrastructure Policy for use of the Institute.

2.5 Hostel Life

Rules and regulations laid down for conduct in Hostels have to be strictly adhered to by each student. Norms for Hostel Management are available as a separate document. Salient features of the said document include:

- (a) Possession and consumption of alcohol or substances of abuse, and smoking are strictly banned in both hostel and Institute premises;
- (b) No one is allowed to enter the hostel or Institute premises in an inebriated condition;
- (c) Each student is responsible to ensure that hostel property is maintained properly;
- (d) Each student is expected to make positive contribution to creating and maintaining an overall ambiance in hostel premises, which is conducive for studies and holistic growth of students; and
- (e) Student should return to their hostel by the time announced by the Warden of the Hostel.

2.6 Use of Motorized Vehicle

No student shall possess or use any of motorized vehicle throughout her or his stay at the Institute. Married students may possess a motorized vehicle for their family purposes with due permission of the Institute. But, in no case, they shall loan these vehicles or allow these vehicles to be driven by any unmarried student of the Institute or anyone else.

2.7 Conduct at and outside the Institute

At all times, students should be polite amongst themselves and towards staff and faculty members. Students are bound to comply with guidance and directions of Institute officials; any disorderly or abusive conduct toward them or interfering in their performing their duties, is as a serious offense. Equally serious are offenses, like adopting unfair means in examinations, plagiarism in assignments and dissertations, disrupting classes, falsifying information to the Institute, forging or altering Institute documents, and damaging Institute property.

Each student should exercise utmost caution and be on constant vigil to ensure that his/her behavior does not harm anybody, directly or indirectly, and that laws of the country are upheld at all times. Further, no student is allowed to be associated with any political party either directly or indirectly in the campus. No regular student can have any professional engagement outside the Institute without written permission from the Institute. Each student should comply with the mandatory attendance requirement as mentioned in the regulations of the academic programs of the Institute. Behavior of no student should constitute any form of harassment or treatment that is demeaning, abusive, threatening or alarming, including disparagement based on an individual's race, creed, ethnicity, national origin, religion, and gender. Further, all students are expected to positively contribute in ensuring harmony among all sections of the Institute community, and take advantage of efforts of Institute towards providing an atmosphere that conducive for academic excellence and overall development of students. Further, all students should refrain from making any kind of campaign against the Institute either individually or collectively. Students must follow the hierarchy of Students Gymkhana for any complaint. In case of no response or dissatisfaction, the student can then approach the Institute authorities. The Institute has established norms and procedures for addressing any legitimate grievance of students. Any attempt to sidestep the established procedure by organized activity will be a serious violation of the Code of Conduct.

When a student undertakes any journey outside the Permanent Campus of the Institute (anywhere in India and abroad) as a *student, representative* or *ambassador* of the Institute, she/he shall:

- (1) Not involve in any gambling and betting activities;
- (2) Maintain the proper timing as instructed by the concerned Faculty Advisor, and go to only such places as approved by the Faculty Advisor in writing; they shall return to place of residence by the time as agreed with the Faculty Advisor;
- (3) Avoid adventure sports and activities, without proper skills and due written permission of parents/guardian and the Institute;
- (4) Follow all safety precautions as applicable at each place of visit;
- (5) Enter into any altercation or brawl with any unknown person;
- (6) Move, as much possible, in groups;
- (7) NOT deal with any persons from the Press and Media; and
- (8) NOT canvas in any election activity.

2.8 Extra-Curricular Activities

The Institute encourages participation of all students in extra-curricular activities, without affecting academic performance. It is the responsibility of students to ensure that their participation in extra-curricular activities does not hamper their studies. Hence, participation in extra-curricular activities can never be cited as a reason for poor academic performance. To ensure that it is enjoined that no B. Tech. student with CGPA of less than 6.0/10.0, no M. Tech/M.Sc. student with CGPA of less than 7.0/10.0 and no Ph.D. student with CGPA of less than 8.0/10.0 can hold any office of responsibility, either elected or nominated. Further, a student who has faced any disciplinary action, cannot occupy any position of responsibility.

Further, student organisers of festivals and other activities should ensure that no extracurricular activity encourages any kind of negative behavior and all laws of the land are strictly followed. Students organising festivals should ensure that:

- (a) All financial transactions, receipts and expenditure, are duly accounted for; a detailed financial statement of income and expenditure, duly audited by a Chartered Accountant shall be submitted, along with all supporting vouchers and a copy of the bank passbook to Associate Dean (Students) within twelve weeks of the completion of the festival;
- (b) All expenditure is incurred within the budget approved at the start of the financial year, to avoid any difficulty in settling the bills;
- (c) Some funding may be sought from outside agencies or individuals as sponsorship of festival events. In this connection, no student should sign any Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) with any sponsor of any event. All such documents should be signed by an authorized signatory of the Institute. Even when the authorized signatory signs such a document, it should be examined to be legally sound, to avoid problems like delayed payment;
- (d) No favor is given to sponsor to use the name of the Institute in its promotional activities; and
- (e) The register kept in Office of Students Affairs should be updated daily with information of MoUs signed with sponsors, money received, expenditure made and other related activities with copies of documents and original bills.

3. DISCIPLINARY ACTION

A student shall invite disciplinary action from the Institute, if he/she violates the Code of Conduct; the actions may include reprimand, disciplinary probation, fine, debarring from examinations, withdrawal of scholarship and/or placement services, withholding of grades and/or degrees, cancellation of registration, and even expulsion from the Institute. In particular, (a) Involvement of a student in ragging/sexual harassment/handling of prohibited substances

may lead to his/her expulsion from the Institute; The ragging cases must be referred to Anti Ragging Committee for appropriate action while in case of sexual harassment the case must

be referred to Convenor, Women Cell.

(b) The Instructor of a course has the power to debar a student from continuing to write the rest of the examination, in which he/she is detected to be using unfair means. An Instructor or

Tutor has the power to take appropriate action against a student, who misbehaves in his or her class; and

(c) The Warden of a Hostel has the power to reprimand, impose fine or take any other suitable measure against a student resident, who violates either the Code of Conduct or rules pertaining to the Hostel.

In other cases, the matter shall be reported to the Student Disciplinary Action Committee duly constituted by the Institute, which shall investigate alleged misdemeanors, complaints, etc., and recommend suitable course of action to the Chairman, Senate. Violation of the Code of Conduct by an individual or of a group of students can be referred to this Committee by a student, staff member, faculty member, official of the Institute or visitor to the Institute.

In exceptional circumstances, the Chairman, Senate, may appoint a Special Committee to investigate and recommend appropriate action for any act of gross indiscipline involving an individual or a number of students, which may tarnish the image of the Institute. The recommendation for any action shall be referred to the Senate. On all matters, other than denial of the award of a degree and expulsion of a student from the Institute, the Senate may give its recommendation, and for its final decision. The Senate may recommend a student, who is found guilty of a major offence, to the Board of Governors, for either expelling the student from the Institute or not awarding a degree (even though the student may have met all requirements for the award of the degree).

A student, who feels aggrieved with the punishment awarded, may appeal to the Chairman, Senate, stating clearly the case and explaining her/his position, and seeking reconsideration of the decision.
